1. Education:

There are 19 public primary schools, 15 private nursery/primary schools, 11 junior secondary schools, 10 senior secondary schools and 8 private secondary schools in Moba Local Government area.

3. L A Primary School, Epe-Ekiti: 10 classrooms in need of renovation;
4. Community Primary School, Isaoye-Ekiti: Most of the classrooms require repairs;
5. Moba Grammar School, Otun-Ekiti: A block of 4 Classroom required reroofing and renovation
6. Aaye-Oja High School, Aaye-Oja: a block of 3 classrooms need serious rehabilitation;
7. Epe Comprehensive High School: 3 classrooms (require total rehabilitation)
8. St Andrew Primary School, Otun-Ekiti: 6 classrooms are dilapidated and need renovation
Eyemojo Comprehensive High School, Osan-Ekiti: 2 classrooms are dilapidated; school needs more blocks of classrooms

8. Health

There are an estimated 10 primary health care centres spread across communities. Majority of the Centres, though functional, are in need of repairs; while the Basic Health Centre along Ikole Road, Ilasa Ekiti is almost being pulled down by erosion. The Basic Health Centre, along Eriti Road, Ahan Ayegunle, built in 2011 was never commissioned or equipped.

The health centres are administered by Community Health Workers; there are no trained nurses and only 1 doctor servicing all the primary health centres in the Local Government.

19. Economic Activities / Available Resources

The major types of businesses carried out in the communities are farming (including poultry fishing), petty trading, and artisan works such as tailoring and carpentry. And the major farm produce produced and sold are: cocoa, palm oil, garri, yam, maize, rice, coco-yam, beans, cassava, cashew, plantain, tomatoes, pepper, kolanuts, okra, pineapple, oranges, banana, and vegetables.

Major challenges faced:

- Lack of credit facilities (loan from government)
- Lack of market
- Poor access roads
- Insecurity
- Lack of electricity

Available Resources

The communities boast of viable lands for farming. In Igbogun community, there is sand and gravel; Ogburugbere waterfall in Ika community; limestone and timber in Irasa community; and Osun River, Olori River, Olotoro River, different types of stone and valleys found in Oke Ila.

20. Basic Infrastructure: Roads

Most of the major roads in the communities are in a state of disrepair. Such roads include: Ajebamidele – Powerline road in Ajebamidele community, which has been abandoned for years; Shasha to Ajebamidele; Moferere, Itamo, Olujoda, Igrigiri and Agric Road in Embassy Island; Ago-Aduloju to Igbogun road; Iworoko – ika – Igede; Ika–Esure; Irasa – Ika road; Ilokun - Afao road; Oke-Ila - Uso; Okegbala, Odooko, and Oke Utere in Odo Ado; and Okeila-Ilado-Iloro-Rosebud.

Few roads are in good condition - Ado - Emirin junction, Ado-Odo-Ilawe road, and the Federal road to Akure. Condition of these roads not known: Irasa town to Ika town, Igede – Irasa road, Omisajana – Ado – Oke Aso road, Adugboku – Odoko – Eepa – Ilawe road and Afao road.

1. Basic Amenities (Water and Waste Disposal)

Water Sources

The major sources of water in the Communities are boreholes, well, and streams/rivers. A couple of communities also rely on rainfall and resort to buying water during dry season, with respect to waste disposal. The communities burn the waste. Pour into pits, throw into pits, throw into the bushes or drainages for the rains to wash them away few have waste disposal bins and rely on the waste management Board to dispose the waste. (see appendix for list of communities and their water sources and waste disposal methods.

2. EDUCATION

Ado Ekiti has 17 public primary schools with 2,133 students and 146 teaches. It has 5 public secondary schools with 5,814 students and 146 teachers. Some communities in Ado North are without Public Primary Schools and send their children to schools in neighbouring communities very few communities have public secondary schools, Ikingbinsin and Oke Ila.

CONDITIONS OF THE SCHOOL BUILDINGS

86% of the schools have buildings that are in need of repairs with some already fallen. Some with cracked walls, leaking roofs etc 68% of the schools do not have toilets and students practice open defecation, while 55% of the schools lack water.
