## **INTRODUCTION**

This is the latest edition of Digest of Local Government Statistics. It gives information in respect to the year 2023 on the sixteen (16) Local Government Areas and twenty two (22) Local Council Development Areas (LCDAs), Institute of Local Government Studies, Ilawe - Ekiti and Local Government Service Commission, Ado - Ekiti.

The publication has nine chapters covering the following areas: Population and Land Mass, Personnel Records, Public Finance, Infrastructure/Public Utilities, Self Help/Community Development Projects, Hotels/Tourist Centres, Traditional Institution/Political Structure, Public Health and Agricultural products.

The basic socio-economic indicators for measuring developments in various LGAs/LCDAs levels were computed. Some charts were used for easy interpretation and understanding of the results.

The information revealed will definitely be of great assistance to the Government, Researchers, Organized private sector and Local/International donor agencies.

# **CHAPTER ONE**

## **POPULATION AND LAND MASS**

## 1.1 POPULATION

The chapter shows the population and land mass of all the 16 LGAs and 22 LCDAs in the State. Using the 2006 population census as base, the projected population figure for the year 2023 is 4,166,374. Through all the year, Ado Local Government has the highest population of 606,779 (14.56%) followed by Ijero Local Government with 378,742 (9.09%) and Ekiti West with 306,581 (7.36%) Ilejemeje has the least figure of 74,185 (1.78%). It is noteworthy that apart from Ikere and Efon Local Governments, the male population is higher than the female counterpart in all LGAs. The record shows that there are more males in the State than female in the year under consideration. See table 1.1 for details.

## 1.2 LAND MASS

The total land mass of Ekiti is 5,805.843km<sup>2</sup> out of which Ikole Local Government has the highest landmass of 874.94km<sup>2</sup> (15.07%) followed by Oye with 661.91km<sup>2</sup> (11.40%), Ado Local Government occupies 345.25km<sup>2</sup> (5.95%) as 9th in the rank and Ilejemeje Local Government has the least of 96.96km<sup>2</sup> (1.67%). Ado has the highest population density with 1,757.5 followed closely by Moba with 1,315.0, while Ikole is with the least 322.33.

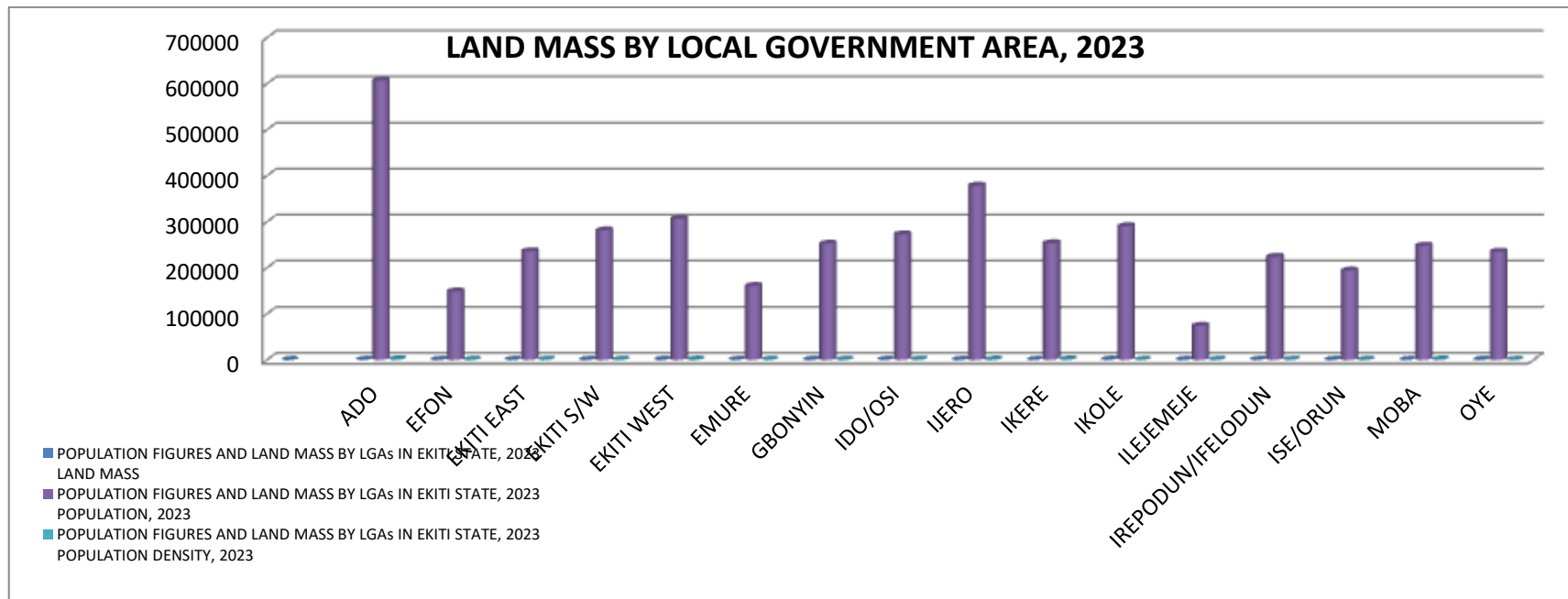

### 1.3 DISTANCE OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT HEADQUARTERS TO THE STATE CAPITAL

The distance (in kilometer) from each of the Local Government headquarters to the State capital shows that Ekiti East (Omuo) is the farthest with 64.65km followed by Ikole Local Government with 49.85km, Efon Alaaye is the third farthest with 47.00km while Ikere and Ekiti South West (Ilawe) are the closest towns to the State capital (Ado – Ekiti) with 13km each.

## **CHAPTER TWO**

### **PERSONNEL RECORDS**

**2.1 PERSONNEL DISTRIBUTION BY GRADE LEVEL AND GENDER**

Information about the staff of the 16 LGAs and 22 LCDAs in Ekiti State for the year 2023 was presented in this chapter. The staff strength is 11,244 out of which 1,360 (12.10%) were on GL 01-03, 2,174 (19.33%) on GL 04-06, on GL 07-09 were 3,031 (26.96%), 2,319(20.62%) on GL 10-12 and 2,292(20.38%) in the managerial level. Out of the total number of staff in the Local Government Service, 5,958 (53%) were male and 5,286 (47%) were female. It was revealed that 31.43% of the workforce in Local Government Service were junior workers, 47.58% were on intermediate level and 20.38% falls to managerial level.

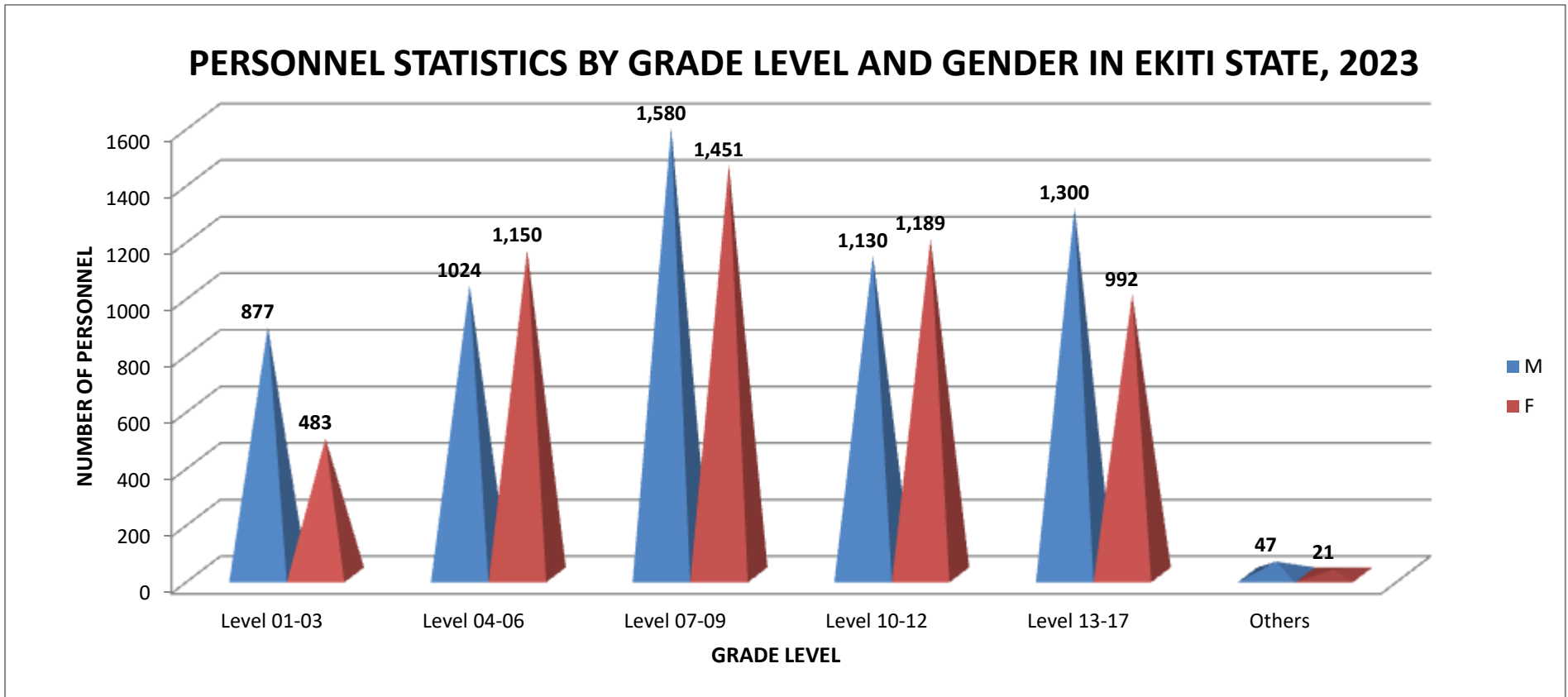

## 2.2 PERSONNEL DISTRIBUTION BY NATURE OF APPOINTMENT

■ PERMANENT APPOINTMENT    ■ CONTRACT APPOINTMENT    ■ VOLUNTEER CORPS & OTHERS

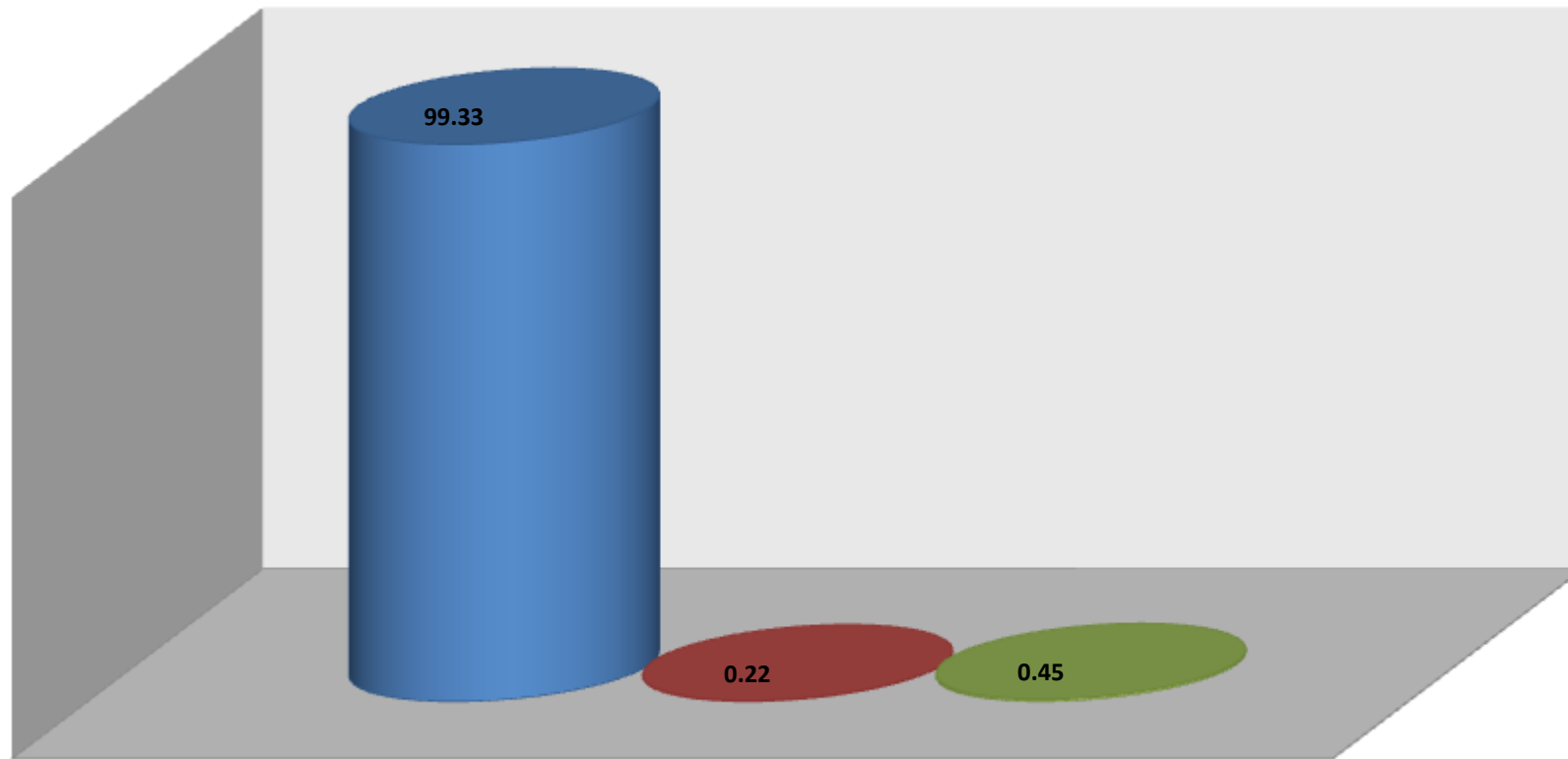

### **2.3 PERSONNEL DISTRIBUTION BY CADRE**

The table below shows that 4.57% of the staff of the LGA/LCDA was in the Administrative cadre, 19.0% were professionals, 14.93% were Technicians, 41.0% were in the Clerical/Executive cadre, and 20.50% accounted for workers who are in other cadres.

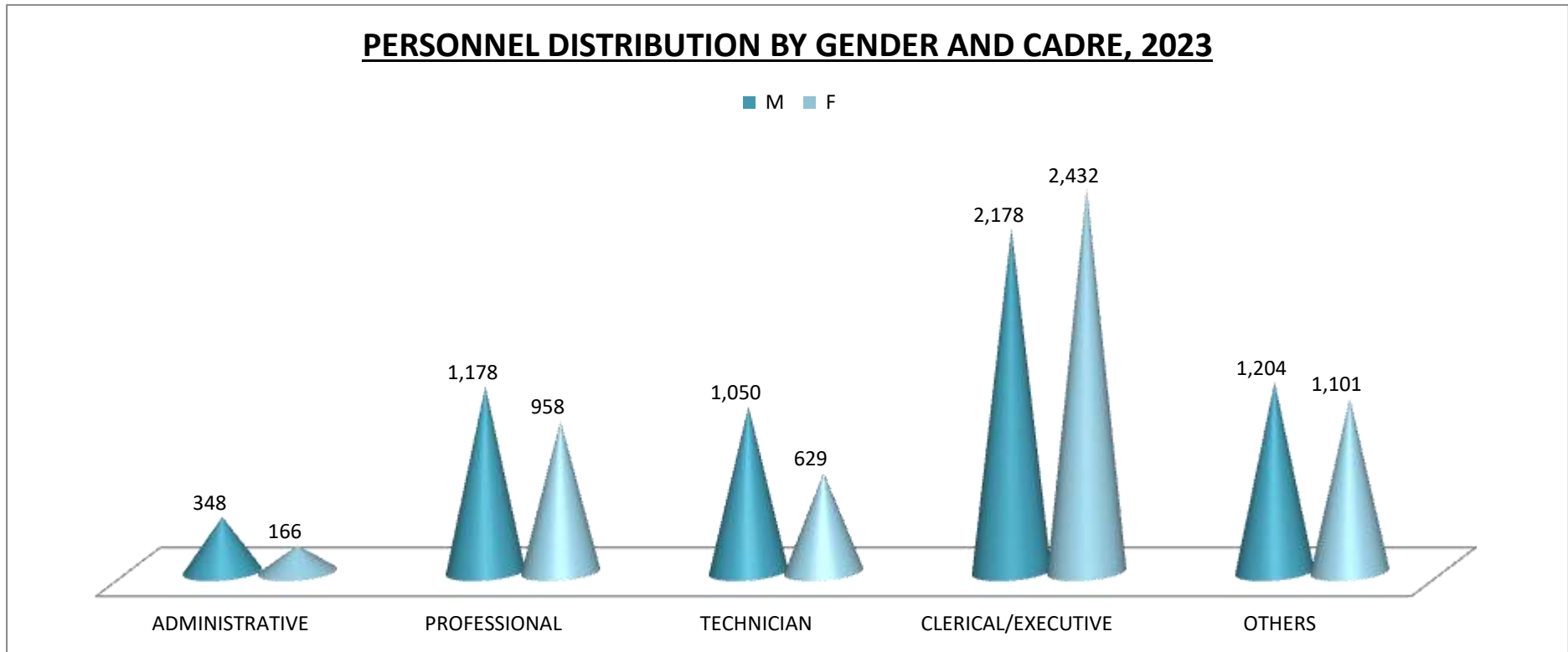

**2.4 PERSONNEL DISTRIBUTION BY QUALIFICATION**

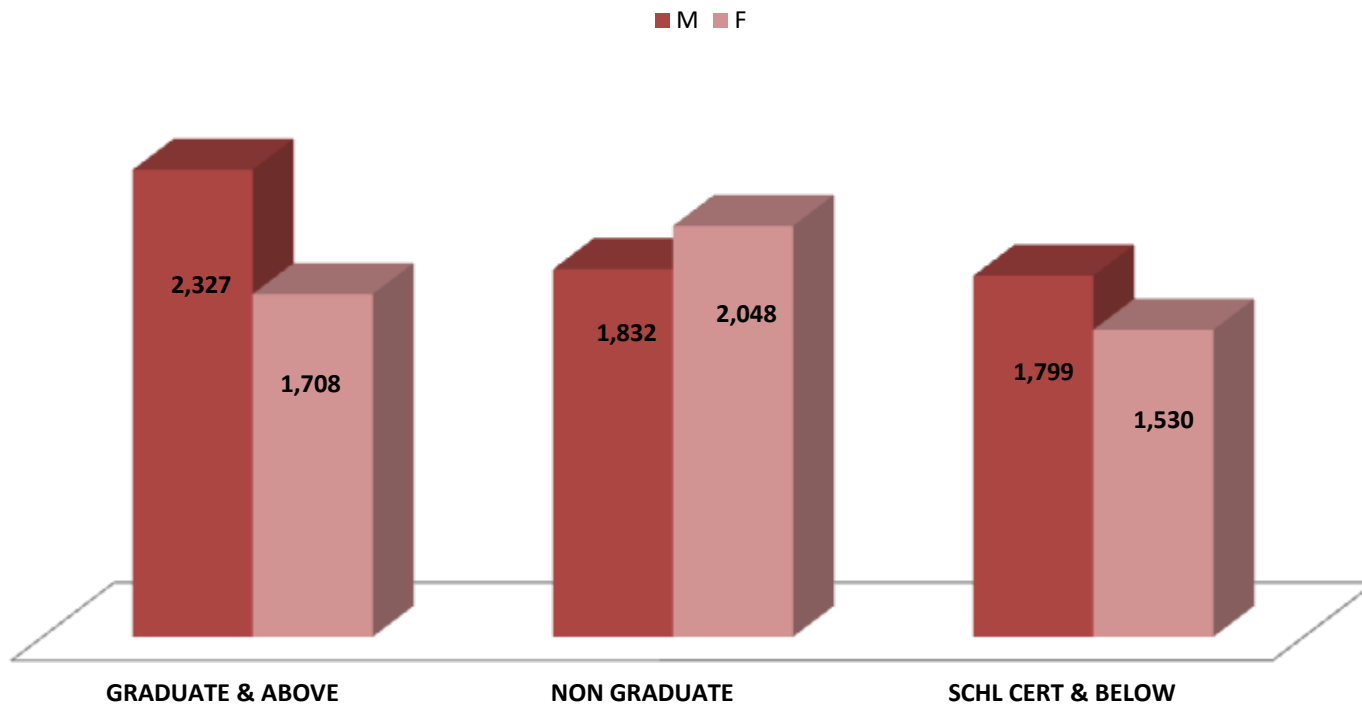

# CHAPTER THREE

## FINANCE

### 3.1 REVENUE

The chapter shows revenue generated by each LGA/LCDA for 2023. It was observed that LGAs/LCDAs got most of their revenue from the Federal Allocation of 37.9%; statutory allocation 1.4%, VAT 7.5% followed by FAAC Augmentation 49.7%, IGR 1.2%, and others 2.3%. See Table 3.1 for further details. .

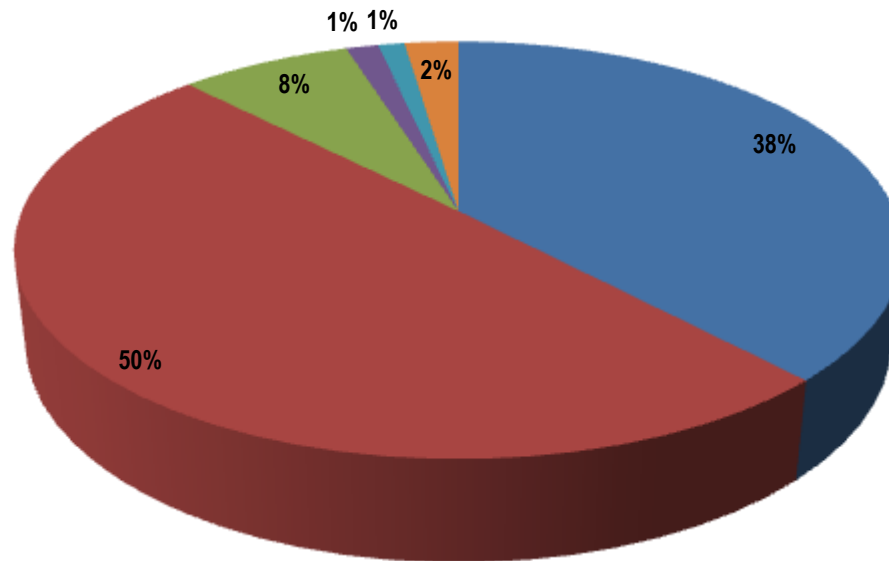

### 3.2 BUDGETARY ALLOCATION

The Cumulative Budgetary Allocation for the LGAs and LCDAs shows that the Economic Sector got the highest share of with 63.3%, with social sector with 18.4%, while General Administration got 14.8%, Environmental Sector got 3.0% and others 0.44%.

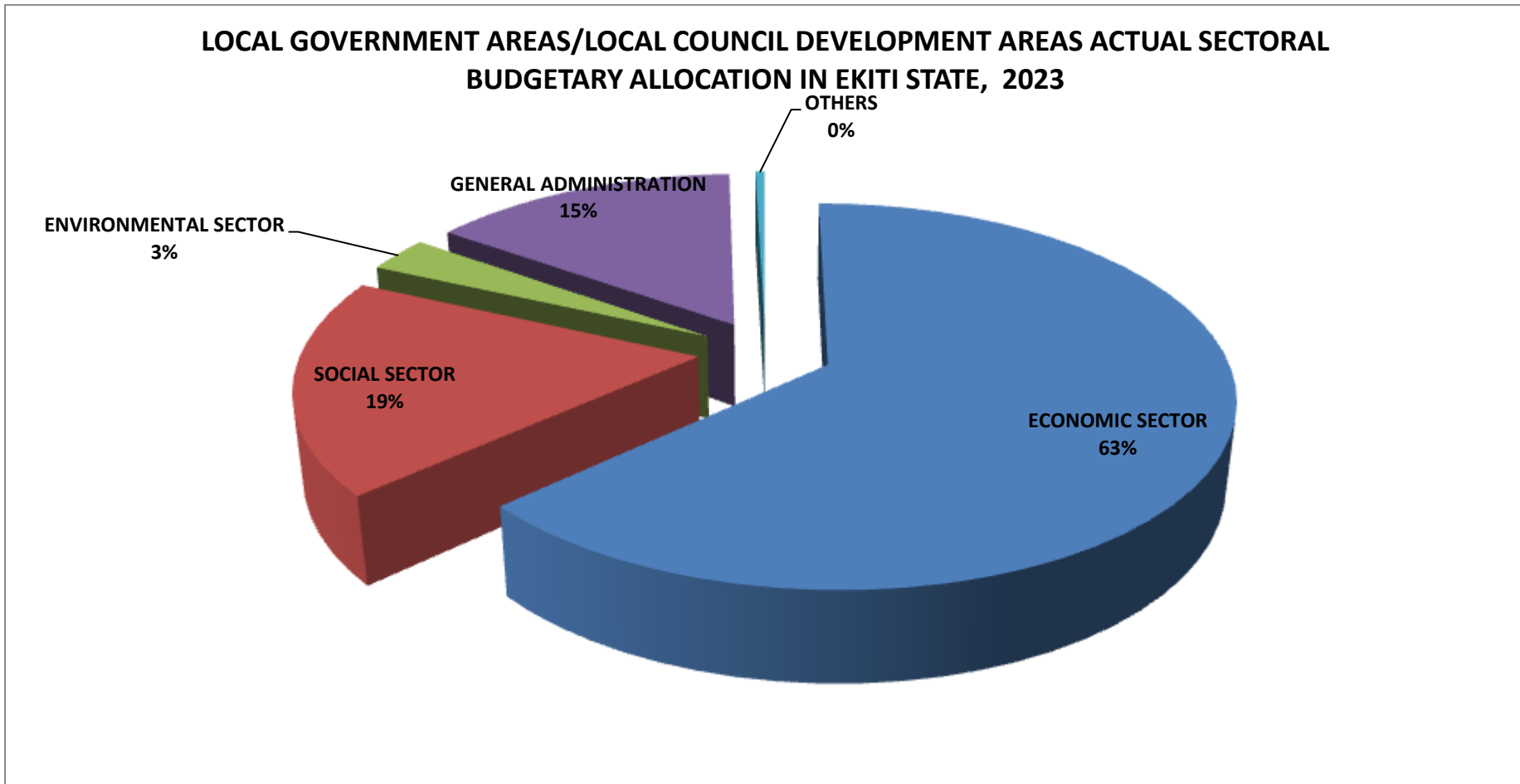

### 3.3 RECURRENT EXPENDITURE

It showed that Ado-Ekiti, Ado-Central, Efon-Alaaye, Ekiti West, Ekameta, Aiyekire and Ido/Osi which makes up about 17.5% of the LGAs/LCDAs expended more than their budgeted allocation, all other LGAs/LCDAs expended less than their budgeted allocation.

### 3.4 CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

It was observed that in year 2023, Irepodun/Ifelodun, Irewole expended more than their budgeted allocation, all other LGAs/LCDAs expended less than their budgeted allocation. See analysis table 3.3 for further details.

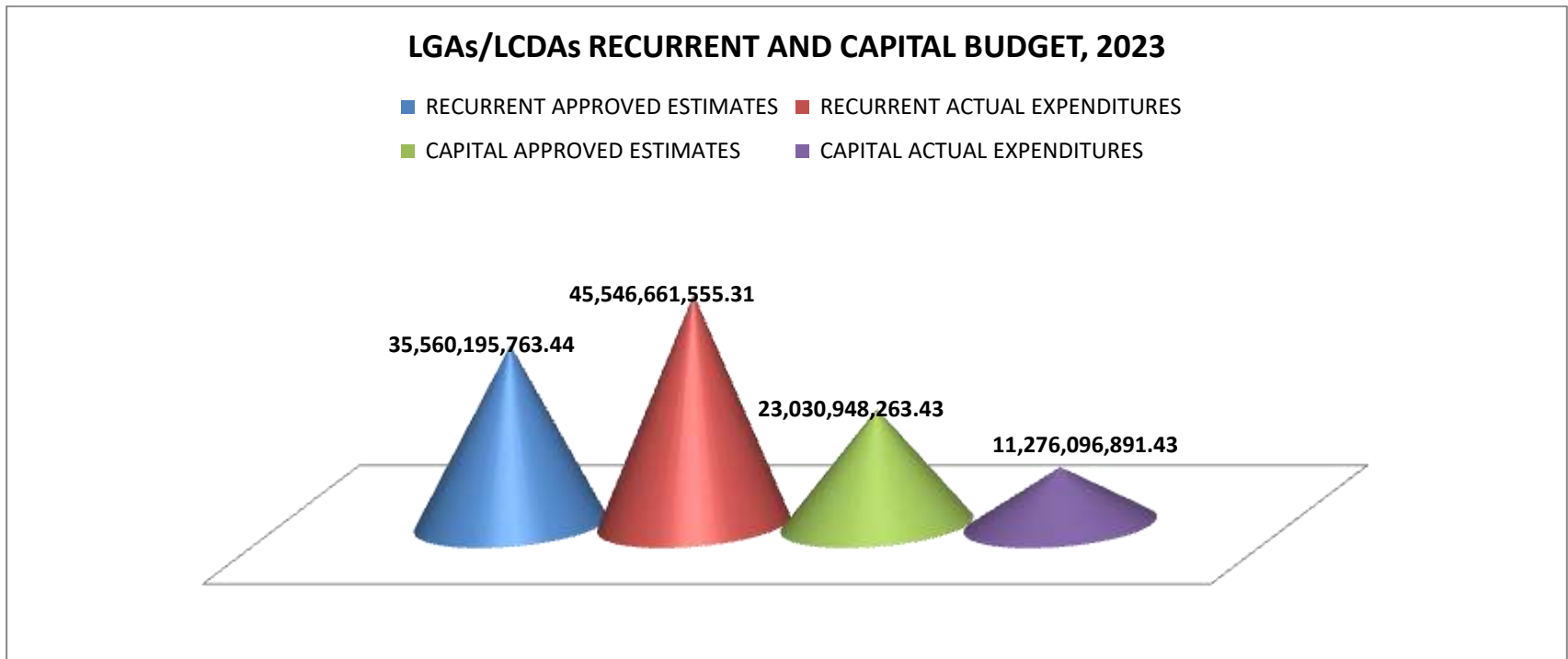

The table above shows the summary of the total roads network in all the sixteen (16) LGAs and twenty-two (22) LCDAs in the State by category in 2023. It is worthy of note that existing road covered about 3112.44km and 230.71km road was rehabilitated. In all LGAs/LCDAs, 24.2km were newly constructed.

#### 4.2 ELECTRICITY SUPPLY, 2023

The total number of towns and villages served with electricity was 240 out of which 4.17% have unspecified sponsors. The Federal Government sponsored the connection of 32 (13.33%) communities, State Government sponsored the connection of electricity in 23 (9.58%) communities, LGAs/LCDAs sponsored the connection in 75 (31.25%) communities and Benin Electricity Distribution Company (BEDC) sponsored the connection in 100 communities. Therefore it can be deduced that more communities in Ekiti State has been electrified in the present administration.

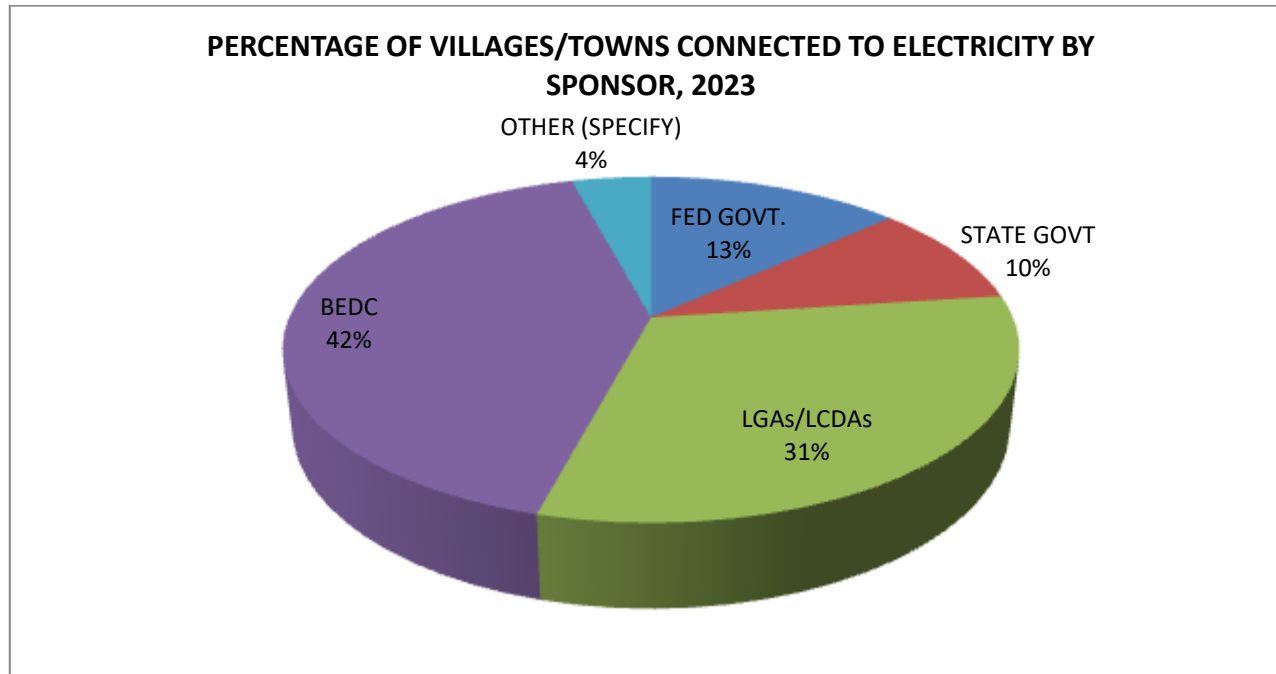

The above table shows the sources of water available in 2,221 communities in the State. As much as 1,106 (49.8%) communities depended on hand-dug well, 198 (8.91%) communities used borehole, 151 (6.8%) communities relied on spring/stream, 103 (4.64%) communities have access to pipe borne water, while the communities that depended on solar powered boreholes and river were 189 (8.51%) and 126 (5.67%) respectively. 15.67% communities have unspecified sources of water supply.

## 6.2 TOURIST CENTERS

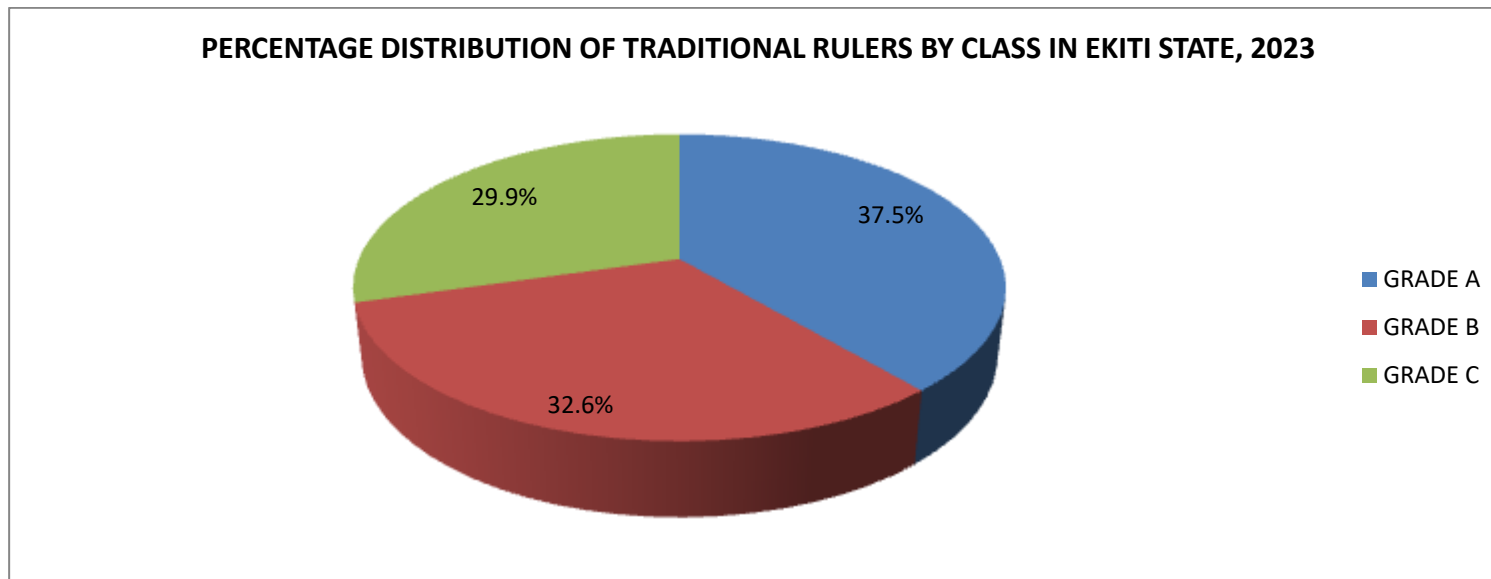

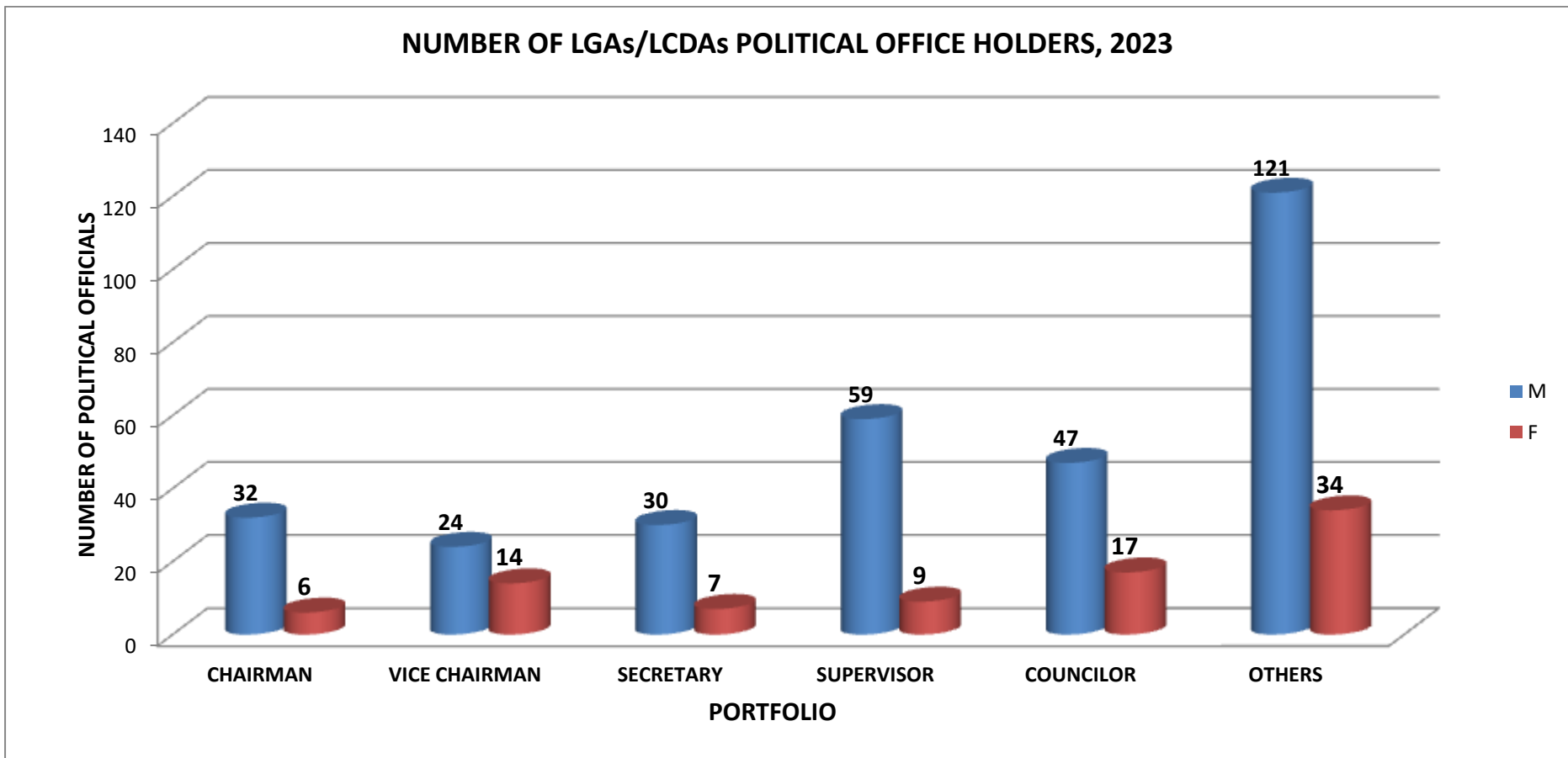

The distribution of the 238 political wards in the State shows that Ekiti East, Ijero, Ikole and Oye with 12 wards each while Ekiti South/West, Ekiti West, Ido Osi, Ikere, Irepodun/Ifelodun, Ado LGA and Moba LGAs have 11 wards each and Efon Alaaye, Emure, Gbonyin, Ilejemeje and Ise/Orun LGAs/LCDAs have 10 wards each.

Ado LGA has the highest number of polling units of 209 followed by Oye with 190 polling units and Ekiti South/West LGA with 188 polling units, Ajoni LCDA has 75 polling units which was the least among LGAs/LCDAs of the State.

# **CHAPTER EIGHT**

## **AGRICULTURAL AND OTHER MAJOR PRODUCTS**

## 8.1 **AGRIC PRODUCTS**

The chapter focuses on major foods, cash crops and other products found in all LGAs/LCDAs. The table of analysis shows that yam, cassava and maize were predominant in all the LGAs/LCDAs of Ekiti State. Specifically, kolanut could be found in Ado, Ekiti West, Emure, Ijero, Ikere, Ilejemeje, Moba LGAs. Rice was predominantly found in Ado North, Ekameta, Okemesi/Ido ile, Gbonyin, Isokan, Ifedara and Irepodun/Ifelodun LGAs/LCDAs.

Record also indicates that cocoa could be found in Ado, Ekiti West, Ekiti South/West, Emure, Ido/Osi, Ikere, Ijero, Irepodun/Ifelodun, Ise/Orun, Efon Alaye and Oye LGAs while Oil palm is majorly produced in Ekiti South West, Gbonyin, Ise/Orun Irepodun/Ifelodun to mention a few. To be specific, Ikere produces beans and Ikole produces teak. Oranges and vegetables could also be found in almost all the LGAs/LCDAs of Ekiti State. See the table below for details.

# CHAPTER NINE

## PUBLIC HEALTH

## 9.1 HEALTH FACILITY

Information on health facility across all LGAs/LCDAs in the State for 2023 is shown in this chapter. There were 509 health facility out of which Ado North has the highest number of health facility in the State with 105 followed by Ikole, Ado-Ekiti and Ise-orun LGAs with 32, 30 and 29 respectively. Irewole, Ikere West had the lowest number of health facility 2, 1 health facility respectively. Out of the total of 509 health facility, 352(69.2%) are government owned, 157(30.8%) belong to private individuals or mission. Details can be found in the table & chart below.

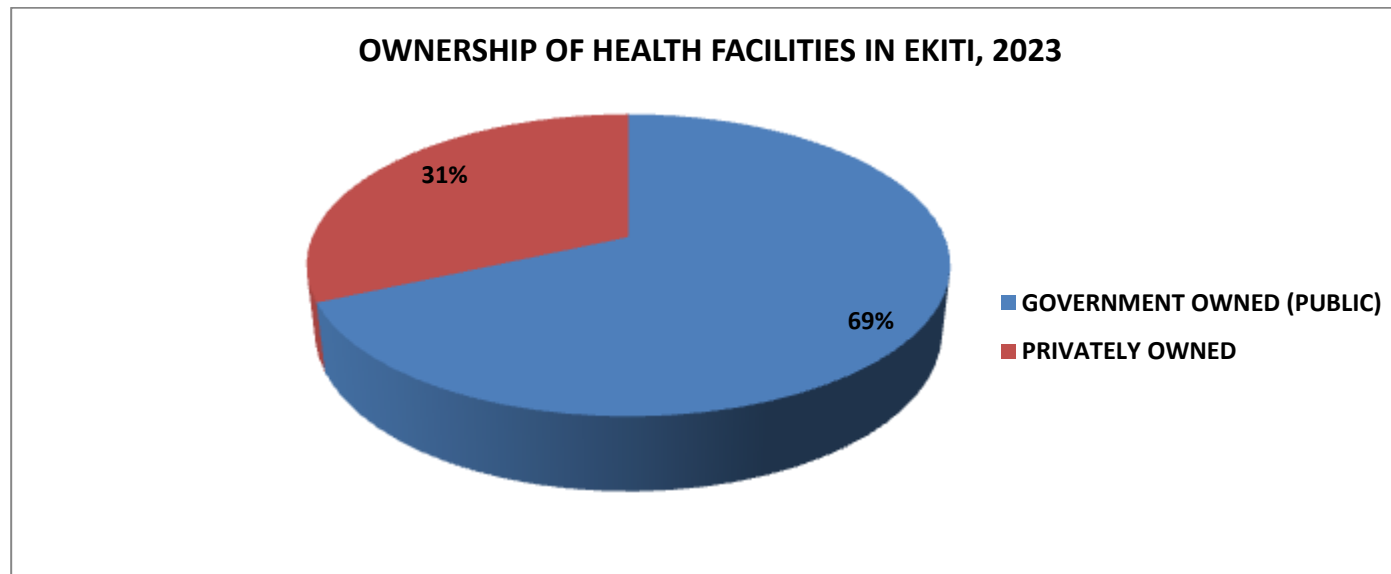
