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FOCUS OF THE 2023 BUDGET

The 2023 Budget christened "Budget of Strong Beginning" is the maiden edition of the present administration which was inaugurated on October 16, 2022. It contains the blueprint of the administration towards the realization of the lofty policies, programmes and projects aimed at improving the socio-economic welfare of the people.

The fiscal document takes cognizance of the Six - Pillar Agenda of the Administration namely: Human Capital Development, Agriculture and Rural development, Infrastructure and Industrialization, Youth Development, Arts, Culture and Tourism, and Governance. Furthermore, the document stems from the Ekiti State Development Plan (2021-2050) which is targeted at sustainable growth and development of the State.

The total size of the 2023 Budget is ₹113,572,718,523.82 which is made up of ₹76,510,633,058.85 Recurrent Expenditure and ₹34,062,085,464.93 Capital Expenditure. The Six -Pillar Agenda is depicted as follows:

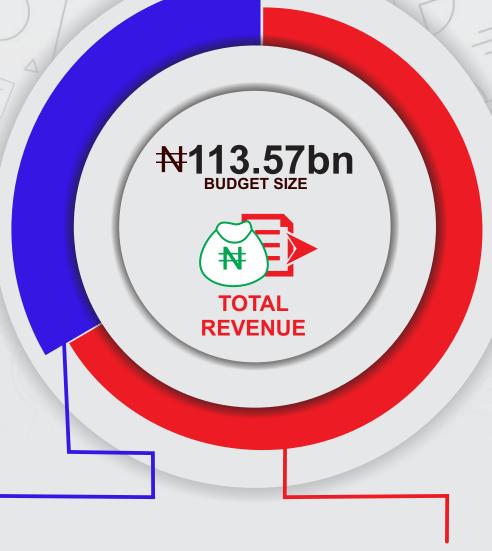

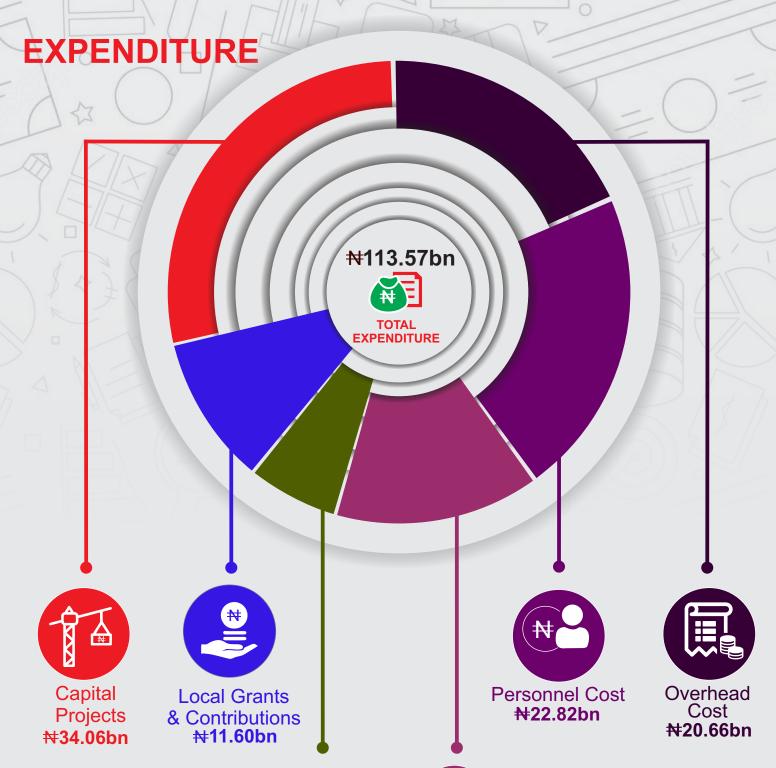

Internal loans are from financial institutions, development Partners and Federal Government all within Nigeria. The loans are meant to finance capital projects in the State

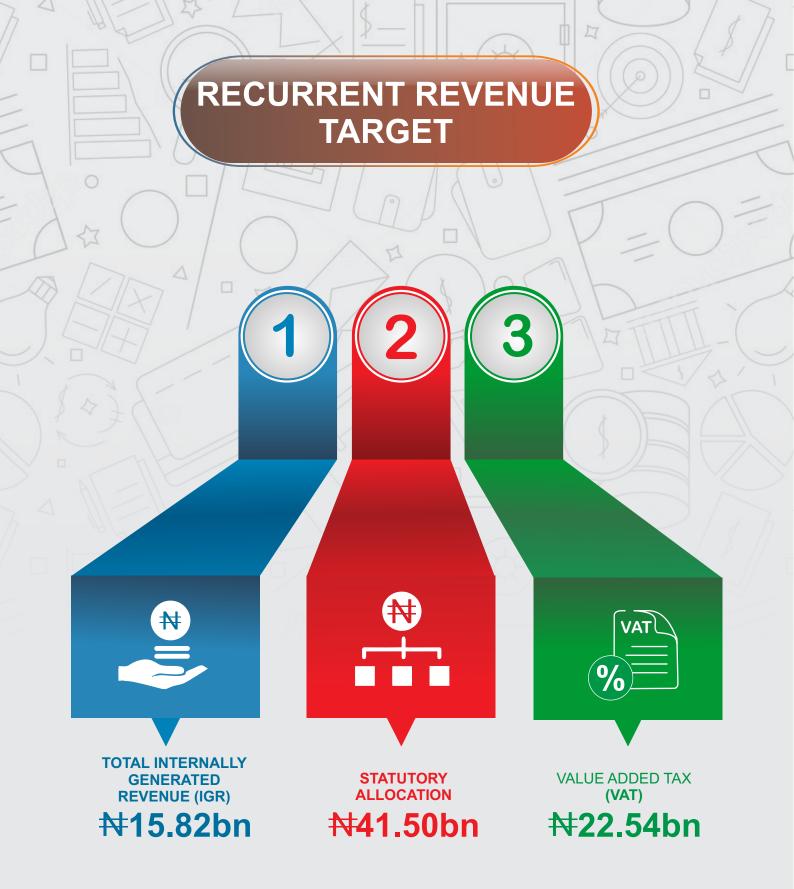
