

**MINUTE OF TOWN HALL MEETING IN EMURE LOCAL GOVERNMENT
COUNCIL ON 2026 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET PLANNING**

ATTENDANCE

OPENING REMARK:

The Head of Local Government Administration (HLA) opened the meeting after opening Prayer led by Director Water Sanitation. He said the Town Hall meeting is being replicated after the State government tour of Local government areas consulting with communities and key interest groups on the needs and requirements of these stakeholders to form the fiscal budget of the State. He said the template for the 2026 budget will be different from other years as Director of Finance and Budget of each Local Government have been invited for briefs at a later date for guide on the form 2026 budget outline.

Kabiyesi Elemure represented by High Chief Aremo gave his speech on:

1. Increased Internally Generated Income for better infrastructure development
2. Youth Engagement for a peaceful administration of the Communities.
3. Government and Traditional Council interaction for better development

Director of Budget Planning reiterated the importance of contributory inputs in the budget items from all stakeholders as items not on budget cannot be executed in the Medium Term Expenditure of year 2026.

QUARTER PRESENTATIONS

ODO EMURE: Represented by Chief Taye Fagbamigbe listed deplorable state of internal roads of the quarter harpingon the Ogbon Uro road linking Ogbontioro Market. He requested for Street lights to lighten up the streets. This he said will dissuade criminals who operate in the dark.

OKE EMURE: High Chief Faleyimu (Owajoba of Emure) represented this Quarter. He listed the almost non existence of old Ise/Emure road which if reconstructed will beef the economy of Emure. He listed deplorable State of Oremeji through St Paul's church to Ariyasi ending at Orija High School junction. Other needs are Pipe borne water, internal security the unfortunate illicit drug centers spotted all over Emure.

OGBONTIORO: Chief Thomas Osesusi represented this quarter. He listed the following:

- * Construction of toilet facilities at Ogbontioro market
- * Drainage of the road leading to Osun river
- * Pipe borne water. Suggested our water reservoir to be linked to Egbe damn.
- * Solar lights to be placed in the market

IDAMUDU QUARTER: Chief Ameyloge the Baale of Adeboye was delegated to represent Idamudu. He highlighted the Idamudu market and the need to build lockup shops there. The road to the market is also highlighted to be in bad shape needing repairs and or reconstruction.

FARMSTEADS

***SASERE COMMUNITY:** Baale Sasere ^{to} appeal the local council management for the hand operated borehole sunk there, few months ago but requested for the following:

1. Grading of road po Sasere. to be Motorable
2. Completion of the Health Centre sewage system
3. Solar street lights to light up the Community at night
4. Perimeter fencing of the Health center and the Pry school for security of life and infrastructure
5. Security Guard for the Health centre

ALAPOTO COMMUNITY:

1. Requested for motor able road to the farmstead

2. Increased security to the Government reserve forest -

EPORO: was represented by Baale Adeduro's son Wobble. He requested for more security presence and timely completion of the Health centre renovation.

ADEBOYE COMMUNITY: Represented by the Baale pointed out non existence of:

1. School for the Community
2. Health Centre

OKESERI: Baale requested for:

1. Opening of Link road between St Andrew ang church and Okeseri
2. Establishment of market for the Community

CHIEF IMAM: Pointed the non functional borehole on Oremeji street beside his house

CAN: Venerable Olabumoye of St Peters ang church represented CAN. He prayed and requested for more security while also emphasising on the bad state of the roads leading to Ogbontioro market

Chief Ajasin suggested lockup shops for Ogbontioro market. He also reiterated the creation of designated area for Cassava processing individuals to avert pollution from the waste emanating from Cassava water.

OBA ADEBAYO DAILY MARKET: The Iyalaja of this market requested for Produce Officer to control produce movements. She also pointed out the increase theft of Goats and requested for increased Security.

Other points raised include:

- a. General laxity of the few security employed in Emure
- b. Non existence of bank which is bringing Risk and hardship to our traders in particular
- c. Epileptic electricity supply and constant and astronomical electric bills

LOCAL GOVERNMENT CHAIRMAN


In his response Emure Local Government Chairman Hon Tosin Adedayo responded as follows:

1. 5km road will be constructed with Emure municipality in some areas and streets.
2. Street lights are being repaired and or replaced
3. Ise/Orun/Emure road is being tabled before the State government
4. Water borehole is dependent on availability of water table after survey
5. Expenditure is budget driven as local government cannot spend money out of Budget. Only in unforeseen and emergency situation can money be expended without budgetary approval.
6. He pointed out that Ajebamidele to Sasere road was expanded last year but Baale Sasere didn't express appreciation for that. (He didn't allow us to comment on his response though)
7. He said RAAMP has approved the construction of the road from Emure township to Sasere through Ajebamidele. The start road will start from Pa Ogunsakin house straight to Sasere.

The meeting came to an end by 1.55pm with a closing prayer from the chief Imam.
